Around 350 school (Primary and secondary) took part with our school achieving an amazing3012 Points/ medals to come in 26th place overall in Ireland. This was a great achievement with 128 boys from the



school taking part against some schools with 500 pupils playing. Many thanks to Mr. Cunningham and the boys for the great effort and we hope you enjoyed the week. We are delighted to announce that we plan to open an ASD class in September 2015. ASD stands for Autistic Spectrum Disorder and the class will be for boys who have been diagnosed with Autism and have been recommended by outside professional agencies , a placement in a special class. St. Brendans PS has a long history of catering for children with different needs and we are looking forward to welcoming new students to the school. This class will follow on from the opening of a class for pupils with Mild General Learning difficulties this past September (2014) and will further enable us to provide the best education to all boys from Birr. The class has been sanctioned by the National Council for Special Education and we await sanction from the Department of Education.

<u>Fire safety at Halloween</u>. 3rd class got an information chat about bonfire and firework safety at Halloween. We ask all our boys to stay safe this Halloween.

<u>Cyber Bullying and internet safety</u>: We were delighted to have Garda Connaughton come to the school to talk to all boys in 4th, 5th and 6th classes about internet safety and the dangers of cyber bullying. It was a very informative talk and we hope that families chat about this at home and especially look at our new anti-bullying policy and appendix regarding Parental responsibilities with regard to social media and safe internet access.

<u>Team Hope— Christmas Shoebox appeal</u>: Mr Kennedy would like to thank all the boys and their families for the great response to this years campaign.
