Class activities in January 2015

Junior Infants :We explored Theme of Weather and recorded it.In Art we created clouds using cotton wool and made umbrellas using paper plates. We painted snowmen and dressed them up using fabric. We sang songs " In the Wintertime" and "The Snowman"

Senior Infants : We have worked on the theme of night and day. We looked at shadows and made our own shadows using torches. We also made different coloured lights and painted shadows of our faces
