October 2015 class activities

<u>Junior Infants:</u> In October Junior Infants explored the theme of Autumn. We printed very colourful trees and painted hedgehogs. We sang songs "Scarecrow Scarecrow" and "Big Red Combine Harvester". Junior Infants also had their first outing to Birr Theatre which they really enjoyed

<u>Senior Infants</u>: Senior Infants have really enjoyed maths stations during the months of September & October. They loved moving to a new & different station every day. Their favourite part was playing maths games.

<u>Rang 1:</u> First Class were busy learning various facts about Autumn. We looked at the sycamore, oak and horse chestnut leaves. We listened to stories about squirrels and hedgehogs & we created owls for art. We were so lucky that we even had a visit from real owls, thanks to Sammy & Mick!

Rang 2: Second class have really enjoyed learning about and following the Rugby World Cup. We have looked at the different countries playing and we have a sweepstake running in our classroom so we're very excited to find out who is going to win the final! We had a lovely trip to the theatre for the Offline Festival to watch the hilarious Big Knights get up to many funny adventures. We all had different favourite stories and the trip was topped off by a visit to the school by Eibhin who helped us all make our own Big Knight character.

Rang 3: This term 3rd class studied the native trees of our school & of Camcor Park. They identified the leaves and fruit of trees such as Oak and Ash. They also discovered we have a very special tree in our school, a Walnut tree. As part of National Tree Week we planted an Alder tree along with Rowan, Oak, Maple/Sycamore trees with Paul Davy of Milltown Garden Centre, Shinrone. No study of native trees could be complete without a trip to Birr Castle to see some of the tallest trees in Europe and some unusual trees introduced to the class by Lord Ross. Biodiversity is the theme of the fifth green flag & St. Brendans & Birr is overflowing with it.

Rang 4: 4th class learned how to identify trees by their leaves & the fruit/seeds they produce. The class went to the castle and collected the leaves, seeds & carried out bark rubbings. The class learned how a plant makes its food and the function of chlorophyll during photosynthesis. The class explored the earth's role in relation to the sun in how a plant knows the different seasons in a calendar year.

Rang 5: During the month of October we learned about the events surrounding the Easter Rising in 1916 with Ms. Costigan. We explored this through Drama & Art. We also learned how to play "Mise Eire", which was composed by Padraig Pearse, on the tin-whistle. We are eagerly awaiting the arrival of the tricolour to the school.

Rang 6: Ms. Grace: We learnt all about Europe & the European Union. We all completed a project on a different country in Europe & presented it to the class. We also completed a project on our favourite athlete for e.g. Joe Canning & designed a fitness regime & a healthy balanced food plan for our athletes.

Rang 6; Mr. Cunningham: We learnt about the ROCK CYCLE. This was where rocks come from and we found out about different types of rock like igneous and metamorphic rocks. This was cool science.
