We wish her and her family the best of health and happiness for the future and we will thank her in due course for the invaluable contribution she makes to the school on a daily basis. Please take note of the following below:

School opening and closing

The school will open to receive pupils at the hour of 9.10am. No responsibility is accepted for pupils arriving before that time. Classes will assemble in their lines on yard when school bell rings at 9.20am. Pupils are asked to arrive on-time.

Classes will normally end for JI (see note below) and SI each day at 2.00pm where pupils are collected from school shed. We ask that you let the boys come out to shed and be seated by teachers and that the teacher then releases boys into care of parent/guardian. Teacher MUST know that each boy has been collected safely. This measure is to ensure that all boys are safely handed over at 2pm.

Classes will end at 3.00pm for all other classes. Parents who wish to have their children escorted home should make their own arrangements to have them met at the school gate and the person escorting them should be at the school no later than 2pm/3pm as the school cannot accept responsibility for looking after children after that time.

New Junior Infants will go home at 12.25pm until Friday 11th September. There will be a short parents meeting in the Junior Infant classroom on THURSDAY 10th Sept. at 12.05pm until 12.25pm where Ms. Ryan will outline some of the work ahead and strategies parents can use with homework. Please note this change of date due to staff meetings.

Apologies as there is an eircom fault with phone lines over the past week so please email school if you cannot get through. We hope to have this fixed shortly.

Cycle Entrance onto high street

This entrance was constructed to provide for the safety of boys who cycle to school. This entrance is open each morning and evening until 3.30pm and can also be used by families who walk to school from the high street area. Parents/ Guardians who drive are asked to use Moorpark st. and Tesco park n stride. Safety is our priority so we this year again, we hope to conduct bike safety checks and safe cycle training for our cyclists. We ask all cyclists to keep wearing helmets and high-vis jackets and for all families to continue to support park-n-stride from Tesco, Walk/ Cycle on Wednesday and our other green school initiatives.

Car park

We thank the school community for your co-operation with our car-park procedures which keep our pupils safe at home time. Reminder to all that the car-park is for STAFF and BUS/TAXI services only and we ask all involved to respect this.

Please ensure that we have the correct contact details for you and that you are receiving texts from our text a parent system. If you have changed mobile phone numbers during the summer please send a note with new number to school and we can update our records.

Pupil excursion forms

All pupils must have a completed excursion form for local class activities and visits which will take place during school times. Eg: Birr Castle, Church, Library, Theatre, Playground etc. This is a carry over form and so only new pupils to the school need to complete it.

Our primary concern is always the safety of our pupils and so as outlined above from the school rules, these items of facial jewellery are not permitted in school due to Health and safety guidelines. School Uniform
