<u>Standardised Testing—Changes</u>

During the month of May Standardised Testing in English and Maths will take place. This year we are using the Drumcondra testing procedures replacing the M.I.C.R.A. and S.I.G.M.A. tests. The Drumcondra tests will provide a more detailed analysis of the pupils abilities in Literacy and Numeracy. Research has shown that scores tend to stay the same or drop when changing testing procedures. Scores will be reported for 2^{nd} , 4^{th} and 6^{th} classes in accordance with D.E.S. regulations.

Assessment and reporting

Classes from 1st—6th are given the standardised English and standardised Math tests during the month of May. Class end of year reports for all classes will be sent home with pupils during week beginning Mon 19th June. Class teachers for academic year 17/18 and school calendar for the year will be included in the report. Just a date to note also for families planning their summer- Boys will return to school on Thursday 31st August 2017.

PA Sponsored walk/ Cycle- 3 years going now and something the boys really loved taking part in. We took a crowd of 50 eager boys (4th-6th) and they split into bikers and walkers and took off for 2 hours of exploring and activity in the park. The bikers each covered an impressive 14 km. <u>Junior Infants</u>: In the past few weeks Junior Infants have been doing great work with Ms.Daly. <u>First Člass</u>: 1st class were busy learning about animals and their young, animal habitats and the lifecycle of a butterfly. The boys enjoyed creating beautiful butterflies with a collage affect.

<u>Second Class</u>: Second class did the school and their parents' proud last Saturday at their First Communion. They sang beautifully with the fabulous accompaniment of Ms. Killeen. They all looked very smart and behaved impeccably. It was a fabulous occasion for all involved and a proud day for St. Brendan's. Well done boys!

Third Class: We are taking part in "Friends for Life "programme. This is an evidence-based anxiety prevention and resilience building programme delivered by NEPS psychologist in the class .The programme is designed to teach students the skills required to manage their thoughts, emotions and body responses to life stresses. The programme also seeks to develop self-esteem and teach coping skills in a simple and structured way. It is a positive, fun learning experience that does not require any clinical assessment or diagnosis and avoids labelling young people as anxious or different.

<u>Fourth Class</u>: Over the last few weeks the class have been very active between athletics, swimming, cycling and hurling. This has been balanced out with preforming for grandparents day, music day and Irish week.

Fifth Class: 5th class got to participate in an 8 week cycle safety training programme with the RSA which they really benefitted from and enjoyed. As part of engineers week they attended a talk by Sarah Delahunt from Offaly County Council in the library. They also constructed their own panpipes in preparation for Music Day. They learned about Blessed Edmund Rice.

<u>Sixth Class</u>: 6th class are busy preparing for the sacrament of confirmation. They attended a retreat in the Monastery in Roscrea to help them prepare also. Best of luck to all the boys on May 27th.
